GMTA CONFERENCE 2018

CHENNY GAN, GMTA VICE PRESIDENT OF PROGRAMS

Make plans now to attend the 2018 GMTA State Conference held on the beautiful campus of the University of Georgia in Athens, Georgia! The conference schedule will highlight 18 presentations by member experts from around the state, along with Peter Mack and Lauren McCall. The Atlanta Symphony Orchestra will perform at UGA during our conference on Friday evening. Members will receive special discounts on tickets. The UGA Kaleidoscope Concert will take place on Thursday evening and will not require tickets.

Conference Recitalist and Pedagogy Headliner: Peter Mack was born in Ireland, where he had his early training with Frank Heneghan at the Dublin College of Music. Subsequent study was at Trinity College, Dublin, and with Bela Siki at the University of Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music and at the University of Washington where he earned his doctorate in piano performance.

Mack has performed throughout the United States and Europe, as well as in Australia and the former Soviet Union. He is the winner of the New Orleans, Young Keyboard Artists and Pacific International Piano Competitions. His prize in the Sherman-Clay competition included a Steinway grand piano. He is well known for his extensive repertoire, having performed twenty-five concertos with orchestras, and is equally in demand as a performer, clinician, convention artist, and teacher; his pupils are frequent winners of local, national, and international competitions.

Commissioned Composer: Lauren McCall is a composer and musician from Atlanta, Georgia. She studied music and science, receiving her master's degrees from the University of Georgia in 2010. She has had compositions performed around the world including her piano piece "Shake the Earth," which was performed in Morehead, Kentucky at Morehead State University's Contemporary Piano Festival and in Eugene, Oregon at the Oregon Bach Festival Composers' Symposium. McCall has also had an arrangement of the spiritual "I'm Troubled" performed in Lakeland, Florida at Florida Southern College for the Grady Rayam Prize in Sacred Music; her graphic score *The Fish Wife* performed in Montreal, Canada by the ensemble Amis Orgue Montreal; and her art song cycle *The Love Song of J. Alfred* Prufock performed in Munich, Germany, in addition to other compositions.

Currently McCall is a music theory-teaching artist for the Atlanta Music Project. She actively participates in the Atlanta 24 hour Opera Project as a composer and librettist, and recently was a composer in residence for the Grady Rayam Prize in Sacred Music. She enjoys collaborating, writing chamber music, electronic music, and music for vocal ensembles and soloist. Along with composing, McCall also enjoys playing classical and jazz music on the clarinet, saxophone, and piano.

Make this the year you attend the GMTA Conference. I am looking forward to seeing each of you at the conference.

She has been the accompanist for the Carroll County Community Chorus for over 30 years, and a member of GMTA for almost 40 years. Jan has served two terms as VP of Auditions, and she has also been Certification and Membership chairs. She currently serves as Secretary, and is a member of the American College of Musicians (Guild) and Georgia Federation of Music. She has adjudicated festivals and Auditions in Georgia as well as S. Carolina and Alabama.

Dr. Owen Lovell is an Assistant Professor of Music, and coordinates the keyboard area at Georgia College in Milledgeville, the state's designated public liberal arts university. He has appeared as a soloist and critically acclaimed chamber musician in 17 US states, Washington, DC, Switzerland, Canada, Mexico, and the Netherlands, with live appearances on National Public Radio affiliates and commercial new music CD recordings on the Albany and Frontiers labels. Dr. Lovell maintains professional two-piano and violin and piano collaborations, delighting audiences in settings ranging from rural community churches to the Kennedy Center. Owen is an MTNA Nationally Certified Teacher of Music, having served actively on the executive board of its state and local affiliates, and is frequently in demand as a

clinician and adjudicator throughout the United States. He earned degrees in piano performance from the Peabody Conservatory of the Johns Hopkins University, as well as the University of Texas at Austin. In addition to his academic position, Dr. Lovell is a piano technician, and the piano review editor for Larry Fine's Acoustic and Digital Piano Buyer (www.pianobuyer.com and in print), the standard consumer reference for piano shoppers. Ashley Craig-Diaz has been imparting her love of music through piano lessons since 1998. She graduated with her Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from Reinhardt University. In 2006, she became the youngest Georgia teacher to receive her National Certification from MTNA. While studying with Susan Naylor and Paula Thomas-Lee and Reinhardt, she was introduced to MTNA and immediately began attending the state conference and serving at the collegiate level. Since graduating, she has remained an active member of both Georgia Music Teachers Association and North Fulton Music Teachers Association and currently serves as co-Vice President of Programs for NFMTA. In addition to maintaining an active studio, Ashley adjudicates, accompanies, presents, and performs all

over the metro-Atlanta area. Her recent performances include solo and collaborative events at the Atlanta Symphony Associates Decorator's Showhouse and Gardens, a fundraising event for the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. Ashley lives in Roswell with her husband Chris, their two beautiful children Fiona, and Eliot, three chickens, and their family dog Piper.



Vice President of GMTA Auditions

Admired for her musical sensitivity and warmth of personality, **Yien Wang** is an accomplished pianist and teacher with a powerful gift for communication, earning her numerous accolades from audiences and critics alike in a diverse range of concert settings. As a soloist, Ms. Wang won the top prize in the 2002 Round Top International Festival Concerto Competition and first prize in the 2001 University of Texas Symphony Concerto Competition. As a chamber musician, Ms. Wang won first prize in the Collaborative Artists category of the 2007 Liszt-Garrison International Piano Competition, the prize for the best string accompanist in the Corpus Christi International Competition (2000), and first prize in the Sidney Wright Accompanying Competition (2001).

At age 16, Ms. Wang participated in recording the CD and piano pedagogical DVD under the Shanghai Arts-Press label for the *John Thompson's Modern Piano Guide*. In 2009, Ms. Wang collaborated with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra trombone section to release *Road Work*, an album recorded in Legacy Hall at RiverCenter for the Performing Arts. In 2013, Ms. Wang collaborated with clarinetist Lisa Oberlander on their CD *Times Like These*, which was released by Potenza Music in 2014.

With over 25 years of teaching experience, Ms. Wang's students have won top prizes in various piano competitions including Music Teachers National Association (MTNA) and Georgia Music Teachers Association (GMTA) piano competitions. Born in Shanghai, Ms. Wang came to the United States in 1999. She holds the Bachelor of Music from The University of Texas at Austin and the Master of Music from the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University. She was a Doctor of Musical Arts candidate in Piano Performance at the Peabody Institute.

Cathy Thacker is a Nationally Certified Teacher of Music in Piano, the VP of Auditions for Georgia Music Teachers Association, a past President of Gwinnett County Music Teachers Association and their 2018 Teacher of the Year. She is an adjudicator for NFMC Festivals and other piano events throughout Georgia.

Cathy's private studio in Snellville, GA, has 45+ students of all ages. Her students participate in recitals, Federated Festivals, local competitions, master classes, and Piano Guild. Many of her students also play

in band or orchestra through school, and she accompanies wind students at Solo & Ensemble, a GMEA event, as well as flute students in recitals. She earned her certification as NCTM (Nationally Certified Teacher of Music) in 2012. A former school music teacher, Mrs. Dasher now owns and operates a full-time music studio, teaching piano, theory, and composition. She has had winners in GMTA, GMEA, and Piano Fest events. She is active in local and state music and arts organizations, holding board positions in GMTA, SMTA, GMEA, and Arts on the Coast.

Mrs. Dasher volunteers her time throughout the state and community, playing piano for churches, schools, community musicals, nursing homes, various music groups, and collaborates with local organizations. 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Member-at-Large

Hailed as a "consummate artist -- brilliant, formidable, effortless, and the epitome of control and poise," **Robert Henry** is an internationally distinguished pianist, performing throughout the world as orchestral soloist, recitalist, and chamber musician. Since winning first prize in four international piano competitions, he has presented solo debuts at Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, and Wigmore Hall. In 2016, he released his third critically acclaimed recording, As the Songbird Sings: Music of Schubert and Brahms.

Mr. Henry earned the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Maryland, with additional studies at the Cleveland Institute of Music and the Glinka Conservatory in St. Petersburg, Russia. He is an MTNA Nationally Certified educator and has lectured and performed at universities, conservatories, and festivals worldwide. He has served as recitalist, clinician, and juror for state, regional, and national MTNA conventions and competitions. He has been featured in American Music Teacher, Clavier, and Gramophone. He is a founding member of the Summit Piano Trio. He is Artistic Director of the Great Performances Concert Series in Highlands, NC, Interim Director of the Atlanta Boy Choir, and Music Director and Organist/Choirmaster of the Episcopal Church of the Incarnation in Highlands, NC. An International Steinway Artist, he maintains his web-presence at www.roberthenry.org.

In 2019, Mr. Henry will present his lecture, "Practicing Like a Pro" at the MTNA National Convention. Mr. Henry is Coordinator of the Piano Department at Kennesaw State University, and is represented by Parker Artists, New York.



Member-at-Large

Michiko Otaki has performed and recorded with such renowned international ensembles as the <u>Graffe</u> <u>String Quartet</u>, <u>Kodaly Quartet</u>, <u>Swiss Wind Quintet</u>, <u>Jose White Quartet</u>, and <u>Martinu Quartet</u>, as well as English violist <u>Roger Chase</u>.

Her unique association with the Warsaw Wind Quintet included numerous extensive tours of the U.S. and Europe, internationally heard broadcasts (including *Performance Today*), and two critically acclaimed CD recordings, one of which received the "Polish Grammy" as "Best Chamber Music Recording." She also made the world premiere recording of the seldom-heard Sextet of Hans Huber with the Swiss Wind Ouintet.

Born in Japan, Michiko Otaki studied at the San Francisco Conservatory and Manhattan School of Music and received her performing doctorate from the University of Miami. She is Director of Keyboard Studies at Clayton State University near Atlanta, where she performs often at Spivey Hall.

Ms. Otaki has performed at major venues including Washington's National Gallery, Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall, Cleveland's Museum of Art, and the Chamber Music Hall of the Warsaw Philharmonic. Her artistry has been featured at Festival Miami, the Da Camera Society of Los Angeles, the Chicago Chamber Music Society, Princeton University, the Harvard Musical Association, BIG Arts, and many other major chamber music series. Michiko Otaki has also recorded and toured with the Brno Chamber Soloists, Slovak Sinfonietta, Brno Chamber Orchestra, Bohemian Chamber Philharmonic, and the Pilsen Philharmonic. Her concerto recordings include works of Mozart, Beethoven and Schumann. Her early first solo recording of Kabalevsky's *Preludes and Fugues* is available from *iTunes* and other major digital outlets.

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MTNA COMPETITIONS

JOANNA KIM, VICE PRESIDENT OF MTNA COMPETITIONS

The MTNA National Student Competitions are the most successful and prestigious student competitions in the country. Each year, thousands of students compete for top prizes and national recognition. Georgia is one of the strong states in the Southern division and has produced many winners in the past. Starting this year, there is a slight change to the three-tiered competition. The first round begins with live state competitions. The winners/representatives of each state's competitions advance to a video-only division competition. Division winners will be the national finalists at the National Conference in Spokane, March 2019. The state competitions are considered the primary educational level with the division and national levels showcasing outstanding performance and honoring significant pedagogical achievement.

Besides the piano, competitions include Composition, Brass, String, Voice, Woodwind and Chamber Music. There is also a new category of piano competition that many teachers are not yet familiar with. In Fall 2017, MTNA launched the MTNA-Stecher and Horowitz Two Piano Competition for pianists ages 19–29. The MTNA-Stecher and Horowitz Two Piano Competition differs from the MTNA student performance competitions because it consists of only two rounds: a Preliminary Round, by video submission only; and a Final Round, which takes place live at the MTNA National Conference.

For state of Georgia, MTNA competition will take place on October 25–27, 2018 at The University of North Georgia, Dahlonega, Georgia. Registration is now closed. However, the MTNA competition is an open audition. If anyone is interested, they can come to Dahlonega and listen to any of the live-audition performances. Dahlonega is a beautiful place to visit with wonderful fall landscapes in late October. I look forward to seeing some of you there.

The **GMTA Broadhurst Junior Piano Award Fund** was established in 1992 by the Broadhurst family in commemoration of Joan Broadhurst. This award is presented annually at the GMTA Conference to the winner of the MTNA Junior Piano Performance Competition. The **GMTA Honors Award Fund**, established in 1993, includes honorary and memorial gifts and is awarded at the discretion of the GMTA Finance Advisory Committee. Awards from this fund are given to senior string, vocal, and brass/woodwind winners of GMTA Auditions. Donations not designated for a specific fund go into this fund.



In addition, DMTA is eagerly anticipating a presentation by Agnes Scott College's Miranda Dorman on performance anxiety and will relish music of Beethoven and Brahms performed by violinist Kim Padgett and DMTA's own Jody Parrish.

Although mentioned in the summer newsletter, it bears repeating that DMTA is experimenting with some substantial changes to our events. First, our Fall Music Fest event will now allow students to play arrangements and sightreading was made optional. Second, DMTA's Jo Evans scholarship has been moved from every spring to every fall and prize money has been changed from several smaller prizes to a single grand prize for each age category. The next Jo Evans Scholarship auditions will take place in the fall of 2019.



Currently 90+ members strong, GCMTA anticipates a year full of educational programs for our teachers and performing opportunities, both adjudicated and for pleasure, for our students. Many of us will attend the GMTA state conference in Athens as well as the national conference in Spokane, Washington and look forward to connecting with our colleagues from across the state at these events!

Our 2018-2019 program lineup is as follows: September- Dr. Benjamin Warsaw "Microcosms/Working Improvisation into Your Practice"; October- Dr. Grace Huang, "Albums for the Young (And Young at Heart); November- Dr. Thomas Martin Wubbenhorst, "Personality Characteristics of Music Educators and Performers"; January-our annual brunch with Yumi Patterson, Cathy Thacker and Pam Asberry with the William Gillock Association USA; February- Dr. Robert Henry, "Practicing Like a Pro"; March-our annual master class with guest teacher Dr. Alex Wasserman; April- executive board meeting; Mayspring luncheon

Our first student event of the year, Music Day, will be November 10. Students K-12 prepare two contrasting pieces for adjudication. Cash awards of \$30 are presented to a percentage of students in each of grades 4-12. It is from these winners that our March Master Class students are selected. We will also offer the GMTA Theory test, typically having 35-40 students participating in this evaluation. Performance Day, December 1, offers students an opportunity to play in a commercial public setting. We look forward to having piano solo, duet, guitar, voice and other instruments there to play holiday as well as other entertaining music. This promises to be a day full of musical gift-giving!

Within the GCMTA membership, there are three separate NFMC Senior Clubs. This major event keeps our teachers very busy from the September meeting when they pay dues to registration in December/January to the three Festivals, all held in February. We have approximately 1,000 students involved in piano solo, piano duet, hymn playing, concerto, voice, woodwind, guitar and theory events. GCMTA presents over \$3000 in scholarship awards to our top three piano students in each district as well as voice, strings and woodwinds. February also ushers in our local auditions. Last year we had 53 entrants, representing 19 teachers, with 43 students receiving OP and progressing on to Regional Auditions and 15 HM/OP/AE at State. We were pleased to have several first time teachers enter students last year, and hope to have even more participating this year! Jr.-Sr. Scholarship, specifically for our high school juniors and seniors, will be held in March. This event is open to students in any instrument and is held as an open audition. A total of \$2000 is awarded in scholarships to the top four performers. Our year culminates with our May Luncheon. At this meeting we announce our annual GCMTA Teacher of the Year. We are pleased to announce our 2018 honoree, Mrs. Cathy Thacker. In further reflection of last year, GCMTA celebrated Susan Andrews being GMTA Teacher of the Year; Pam Asberry and Debra Brady composed and published new music; Yumi Patterson founded the Gillock Society USA; and teachers pursued furthering education through new certifications and performed in Musicale Groups, Orchestras, and Symphonies. GCMTA looks forward to 2018-2019 year as we learn together and educate our students with excellence!
